Country flushes clear, while city blocks up

While metropolitan Adelaide recorded a 31 per cent increase in the number of sewer main blockages from March to April (303 to 441), regional communities have heeded advice to only flush the three Ps – pee, poo and (toilet) paper – almost halving the amount of local blockages over the same period (17 to 9).

Unflushable toilet paper alternatives like wet wipes, tissues and paper towel, as well as sanitary pads, tampons, kitchen scraps and grease, are the primary cause of blockages across SA Water's 9000 kilometre network of sewer mains across the state.

SA Water's General Manager of Customers, Strategy and Innovation, Ms Anna Jackson said it is pleasing to see country customers changing their flushing habits, which is a result that provides benefit for everyone.

"We spend hundreds of thousands of dollars each year removing items like wet wipes from its pipes and wastewater treatment plants, but it's not just SA Water infrastructure these 'unflushables' can cause problems for," Anna said.

"If you flush anything other than the three Ps down the toilet, or put food scraps and cooking oils down the kitchen sink, they can cause a blockage in your own internal plumbing.

"Eventually, what's gone down will also come back up through the toilet or drain and into the street, your yard or even worse, your house, resulting in a messy and costly – but avoidable – inconvenience.

"Pouring cooking fats and oils down the drain can line your pipework and make it difficult for the good bacteria to process once it reaches our treatment plants. It can also lead to the infamous 'fatberg'.

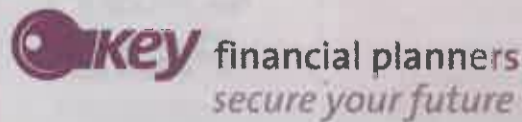
